Greetings,

So far this year we have had 19 violent crimes compared to 20 last year. Violent crime in February was up by one compared to last year. We went from 6 to 4 in robberies. 2 of these were committed by two different groups of juveniles in different areas. We made an arrest of a juvenile in another robbery in Church Hill North. The other robbery occurred on Tuxedo Boulevard and was reported a week after the crime. Aggravated Assaults is were we saw the increase. We went from 3 to 7. Three of these came from the shooting that occurred in the 4900 block of Government Road (Greater Fulton). We are having a community meeting in regards to this senseless act, see the flyer in reference to location and time. The other 4 aggravated assaults were committed by people with poor problem resolution skills. One of those being a mother that threw bleach on her daughter. Another was a stabbing victim that went to Community Hospital, this victim refused to tell us where it happened, what happened, and did not want the police to be involved. The third assault was a case of two friends arguing over a phone conversation which led to a knife fight. The victim did not want to do anything about it since they were "friends". And finally, the last incident was an argument that resulted in the victim being stabbed with a fork. This victim did not want to do anything about the incident either.

Property crime for February was down by 3%. Burglaries went from 6 to 10. We made an arrest of a juvenile (3rd time being arrested for burglary in Church Hill) in one of the Church Hill burglaries and we are looking at connections to others. We have also arrested a person of interest in another Church Hill burglary. One of our victories was in the crime of Theft from Motor Vehicles. This went from 6 to 0. Larcenies in general went from 24 to 20. We had one Motor Vehicle theft. An arrest was made for this crime. Property crime for the year is down by 20% and overall crime is down by 17%.

Congratulations to officer Jordan Clark who was named Officer of the Month. This was in part to his selfless act of helping a man who's wheelchair battery had died on him. He pushed the wheelchair 2 blocks to a bus stop which is no small feat considering its inoperabil-

ity. He then arranged for GRTC to pick him up and take him to a bus stop by his home. Office Clark then followed the bus and pushed the gentleman the rest of the way to his house. A citizen in the community took a picture of the heartwarming act and it went viral on the internet. He received messages from people all over the world. Great Job Officer Clark!

For those of you that could not make it to our last "Coffee with a Cop" we are doing it again on March 8th, 2014 (see flyer).







