Section 106 Review – Notice of Adverse Effect for the Demolition at 1333 North 27<sup>th</sup> Street

Notice on October 7, 2011 is hereby given, primarily via electronic mail, regarding the Section 106 review of a federal undertaking at the above-referenced address that will result in a finding of Adverse Effect. The proposed demolition is an undertaking because it is taking place in an area that may receive such funding in the future. The undertaking will result in an adverse effect because it will result in the demolition of a contributing property in the Church Hill North Historic District.

## The building has been declared an imminent hazard to public safety, and the demolition is proceeding immediately on an emergency basis (see the attached documentation).

The City is taking steps to address the adverse effect in accordance with procedures set forth in the Richmond Programmatic Agreement (PA), for the Section 106 Review of HUD-related undertakings. Attached you will find a copy of the information packet for the undertaking. On August 18, 2011 the Virginia Department of Historic Resources (DHR) received information regarding the above referenced project for review and comment pursuant to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended.

DHR understands that the dwelling located at 1333 N. 27<sup>th</sup> Street has been declared an imminent threat to public safety by the Commissioner of Buildings and demolition will proceed on an emergency basis to address unresolved property maintenance code violations. As you know, 1333 N. 27<sup>th</sup> Street (DHR ID# 127-0820-0677) contributes to the National Register of Historic (NRHP)-listed Church Hill North Historic District (DHR ID# 127-0820). As such the dwelling and historic district must therefore be considered historic properties for the purposes of Section 106.

The demolition of NRHP-listed building is an adverse effect. The proposed mitigation in the form of intensive level documentation is an appropriate level of mitigation is in keeping with Stipulation VIII.(D.) of the Programmatic Agreement Between the City of Richmond and the Virginia Department of Historic Resources Regarding the Section 106 Review of Community Revitalization Undertakings that Receive Federal Funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for which the City of Richmond, Virginia, is Obligated to Complete Section 106 Review.










View of west and north elevations from the west (taken from 27th Street)




View of west and south elevations from the west (taken from 27th Street)






View of north and west elevations from the north (taken from the side yard)
