## First Precinct - Sector 111

Greetings,

Sector 111 for the month of September showed a 27% reduction in Violent Crime compared to the same reporting period last year. There was a 60% reduction in Robberies and a 80% reduction in Aggravated Assaults. Property Crime for Sector 111 was up against a very low number from last September. Sector 111 typically has 50 to 60 property crimes per month. Last year there were 34 property crimes in the month of September. This September we had 50 property crimes which was an increase of 16. We continue to see an increase in Motor Vehicle Theft. A piece of good news is that we did not have any thefts of Mopeds in September which had been an issue and Burglaries in September were down by 50%.

We are still asking people to call the police if they see tow trucks in their area that seem to be towing cars for no apparent reason. We have had a couple cars that have been towed off properties that may have appeared to be abandoned. But in actuality, they were stolen off the property.

We also had a couple packages that were stolen off peoples front porches. If you remember last year this was a problem, an arrest was made and the offender received a substantial jail sentence. Here are some helpful ideas to prevent this from happening to you. Choose a shipping option that requires you to sign for delivery. Check on the package's delivery status online so you can try to be home when it arrives. Have the package shipped to another location where someone can receive it, like your office or a friend's home. Ask the delivery service to hold your package for customer pick-up. File a theft report immediately if you think your package was stolen and contact your credit card company to find out if it offers a purchase-protection service that might reimburse you for stolen purchases. Please be alert regarding this issue again.

The community continues to assist us in getting people off the street that commit these crimes. Leonard Miller was wanted for grand larceny in reference to a stolen car. Within 24 hours of his wanted poster being sent out to the Church Hill People's News, Neighborhood Watch Groups, and the local media he was arrested because of a callers tip. Barry Coles is currently wanted for Felony Petit Larceny for stealing property in a Church Hill Neighborhood. He is wanted because of some alert residents in the area that assisted with that investigation. I have attached his wanted poster to the Newsletter. Lets keep up the good work together!






